Journalism 101

Early Life and Career

- * Born on July 28, 1957 in San Antonio Texas
- Attended journalism school at Texas Tech University
- * Began Career at 15 as a copy boy for Lubbock Avalanche-Journal in Texas
- * Started with KESL in Lubbock, where he worked from 1975 until 1978
- Worked for KXAS-TV Dallas/Fort Worth from 1978 till 1981
- * Also worked as a producer/reporter for WFAA-TV Dallas/Fort Worth from 1981-1989

CBS

- Joined as New York based reporter in 1989
- * He was assigned in 1990 for a year in Dhahran, Saudi Arabia, to cover the Persian Gulf Crisis
- Served as a correspondent in Dallas where he covered many big domestic stories
- 1992 assigned to the presidential campaigns of Bill Clinton and Ross Pero
- In 1993 he reported on the WTC bombing, 1994 Los Angeles Northridge earthquake, Hurricanes Andrew and Hugo, and NASA's shuttle missions
- * In 1997 named Chief White House Correspondent where he broke more stories than anyone





CBS Continued

- * On 9/11 he was one of the first reporters on scene at the WTC
- * Done extensive reporting on the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan
- Joined 60 minutes in 2004
- May 2011 named anchor and managing editor for "CBS Evening News"
- * Has won multiple awards which include:
- * Alfred I. duPont Silver Baton
- 3 George Foster Peabody Awards
- 18 National Emmy Awards
- * 5 Edward R. Murrow Awards and many more







What makes him a great journalist in my opinion

- The way he projects himself on T.V.
