1) Born on July 28, 1957 in San Antonio, Texas
2) Attended journalism school at Texas Tech University:
- Did not graduate
3) Began career at 15 years old for the Lubbock Avalanche-Journal as a copyboy:
- Lied about his age to get the job as he had to be 16
4)Started with KSEL in Lubbock, where he worked from 1975 until 1978
5)Worked for KXAS-TV Dallas/Fort Worth from 1978 till 1981
6)Also worked as a producer and reporter for WFAA-TV Dallas/Fort Worth from
1982-1989
B) CBS
1)Joined as New York based reporter in 1989
2) He was assigned in 1990 for a year in Dhahran, Saudi Arabia, to cover the Persian
Gulf Crisis:
- Covered Baghdad as well as broadcasting live reports of Iraqi missile attacks on
Saudi Arabia

3)Served as a correspondent in Dallas, where he covered many big domestic stories:

- -Oklahoma City bombing and the trial of of perpetrator Timothy McVeigh
- 4)1992 assigned to the presidential campaigns of Bill Clinton and Ross Pero
- 5)In 1993 he reported on the WTC bombing, 1994 Los Angeles Northridge earthquake,

Hurricane Andrew and Hugo, and NASA's shuttle missions

- 6)In 1997 named Chief White House Correspondent where he broke more stories than any other correspondent:
 - -First reported that Monica Lewinsky had became a cooperating witness in the the Office of the Independent Counsel Investigation
 - -Reported that President Clinton was going to be impeached
 - -President Clinton had been subpoenaed to testify before a grand jury

7)On 9/11 he was one of the first reporters on scene at the WTC:

- -He won awards for live reports from Ground Zero and which included the search and recovery operations exhibiting his ability to provide an extensive knowledge of news events.
- 8) Done extensive reporting on the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan
- 9) Joined 60 minutes in 2004:
 - -Half the majors awards are his for the program
 - -Some his "60 Minutes" assignments include:
 - . conducting the only interview with one of the Navy SEALs who helped kill Osama Bin Laden
 - .An interview with the chief accuser in Major League Baseball's doping case against Alex Rodriguez of the New York Yankees

- 10)May 2011 he was named anchor and managing editor for "CBS Evening News":
 - -Became America's fastest growing network evening news broadcast under him
 - -Replaced Katie Couric whose ratings were not on par
 - --460,000 views to 720,000 views two seasons hew was there
 - -N.B.C, A.B.C started with Anthony Weiner Scandal, on his first broadcast he started with Afghanistan and the fighting of insurgent on the shared border with Pakistan
 - -The New York Times article by Alessandra Stanley "signaled no-nonsens newsman"
- 11) Has won multiple awards which include:
 - -Alfred I. duPont-Columbia Silver Baton
 - 3 George Foster Peabody awards
 - -18 National Emmy Awards
 - -5 Edward R. Murrow awards and many more
