General Purpose: To inform

- C. Besides the main plot and issue of Spencer's sexuality "South of Nowhere" deals with more problems. Issues such drug addiction, abortion, depression, gun violence, and tragedy arise in this television show as well.

And as their friendship progressed so did their attraction in a very realistic, cinematic way. For example when their hands softly touch the camera is always right on top of it.
